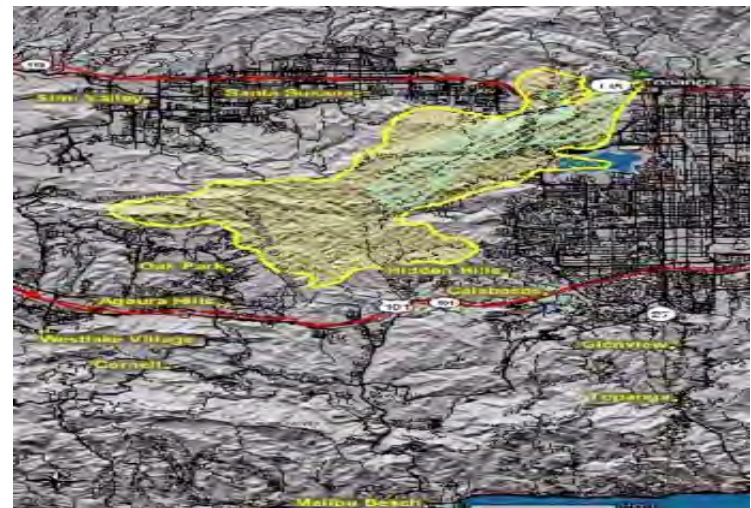

Family Communication Plan

Emergencies can happen at any time. Does your family know how to get in touch with each other if you are not all together?

Before an emergency happens, have a family discussion to determine who would be your out-of-state point of contact, and where you would meet away from your home — both in the neighborhood and within your town.

Let them know you're OK!

Pick the same person for each family member to contact. It might be easier to reach someone who's out of town.

P.A.S.S.

- P**ull pin.
- A**im at base of fire.
- S**queeze handle.
- S**weep side to side.



Aim at base of fire.
Stand back 6ft (2m).



Have You Assembled Your Family & Pets Go Kits?

First Aid & Medical Kit

- First aid kit & manual
- Prescription medicines (2 week supply)
- Copies of prescriptions
- Eyeglasses/Contact lenses, cleaning solution, eyeglass repair kit
- Hearing aid & batteries
- Medical support equipment (cane, walkers, wheelchairs, oxygen & tubes...etc.)
- Disposable gloves

NOTE: Needs will vary based on your family members' individual medical need.

Sanitation & Hygiene Supplies

- Towelettes, body wipes, soap & hand sanitizer
- Washcloths & towel
- Toothpaste & toothbrush
- Deodorant
- Toilet paper

Clothes & Bedding

- Complete change of clothes
- Sturdy shoes/boots
- Extra socks & underwear
- Blankets
- Sleeping bags & pillows

Important Documents & Copies

- Personal ID, Driver's License, Social Security Card Insurance Card
- Cash, Credit Cards & ATM Cards
- Birth & death certificates
- Property deed, lease, Will& insurance documents
- Contact information for doctors, pharmacist & caregiver
- Emergency contact list (family & friends)
- List of models & serial number for appliances, equipment & medical supplies

Food & Water (3-5 Days)

- Canned meat, fruit, soup, & beans
- Canned, boxed, or powdered juices or milk
- Peanut Butter, nuts, crackers, granola bars & trailmix
- Special foods for special diets

Tools & Miscellaneous

- Battery-powered radio & tv
- Cellphone, camera & chargers
- Flashlight & extra batteries
- Manual can opener
- Booster cables & tank fill of gas

Pet Supplies

- Extra food (store in waterproof containers)
- Medications & pet first aid
- Pet ID tags & medical records
- Proof of ownership (photos, chip...etc.)
